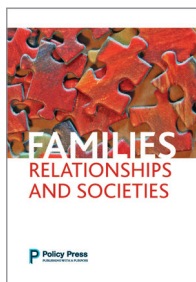
Our education list focuses on education policy and the inequalities that are both in-built in education systems and perpetuated by them.
